Islands, Saint Vincent & the Grenadines, Trinidad & Tobago and Puerto Rico. Proceeds obtained from the festival and other annual events are used for charitable undertakings, such as awarding scholarships to Caribbean and Caribbean/American students, attending two-year or four-year colleges; aid to fund-raising hurricane victims; burnt out victims, and bereavement support in the Caribbean/American community.

Spruce Street Harbor Park (SSHP), Philadelphia's urban Waterfront oasis, is a vibrant retreat along the Delaware River that blends laid-back vibes with a distinct Philly flavor. Created and managed by the Delaware River Waterfront Corporation (DRWC), the seasonal park offers free access to beloved outdoor amenities—including colorful hammocks, floating barges, beautifully lit trees, live music, and entertainment.

More than just a park, SSHP has become a launching pad for Philly's culinary creativity and a hub for local fare, with pay-as-you-go food and drink options. On the national radar and beloved by locals, the park draws visitors from near and far—but it's true magic lies in its ability to welcome everyone to unwind and have fun, regardless of background.

DRWC Presents "States of Change" Flag Exhibition Now through August 31, 2025

The exhibition features 16 national, international, and Philadelphia-based artists who were selected from a competitive pool of applicants to create pendant flags, which will be on display at Spruce Street Harbor Park running now through August 31. All ages. Free and open to the public.

The "States of Change" outdoor exhibition at Spruce Street Harbor Park features flags that represent themes of transformation, resilience, and perception. These flags highlight the ever-changing nature of urban life and the shifting identities within communities.

Some flags use bright colors and moving images to illustrate how things can change, while others challenge the notion that things always remain the same. Some include pieces of history to help people reflect on hidden stories and how we're all connected, especially during times of change in our cities.

Austen Camille Weymueller's "Here, Twice A Day, We Are Held by the Ocean" Now through October 5, 2025

Step into a one-of-a-kind art experience along the waterfront. Here, Twice a Day, We Are Held by the Ocean is a special installation that combines sculpture and augmented reality (AR) animation, designed to connect you with the rhythms of the Delaware River. Inspired by how the ocean's tides shift the river's waters twice a day, this outdoor artwork brings the story of rising seas and our changing environment to life.

The installation is free and open to the public. All ages are welcome. The installation will be located on The Quay at Penn's Landing Marina, adjacent to Spruce Street Harbor Park.

CHERRY STREET PIER

An incubator for creativity, community, and connection, Cherry Street Pier ("CSP") is a reimagined creative hub on the Delaware River Waterfront. Jointly serving as a year-round venue, working artist studios, and gallery space, Cherry Street Pier brings people together through art, culture, and community. Originally constructed in 1919 as Municipal Pier 9, the reimagined space honors Philadelphia's industrial Waterfront roots while showcasing the city's creative future. Stewarded and managed by the Delaware River Waterfront Corporation (DRWC), it plays a vital role in creating access to Philadelphia urban Delaware River waterfront.
