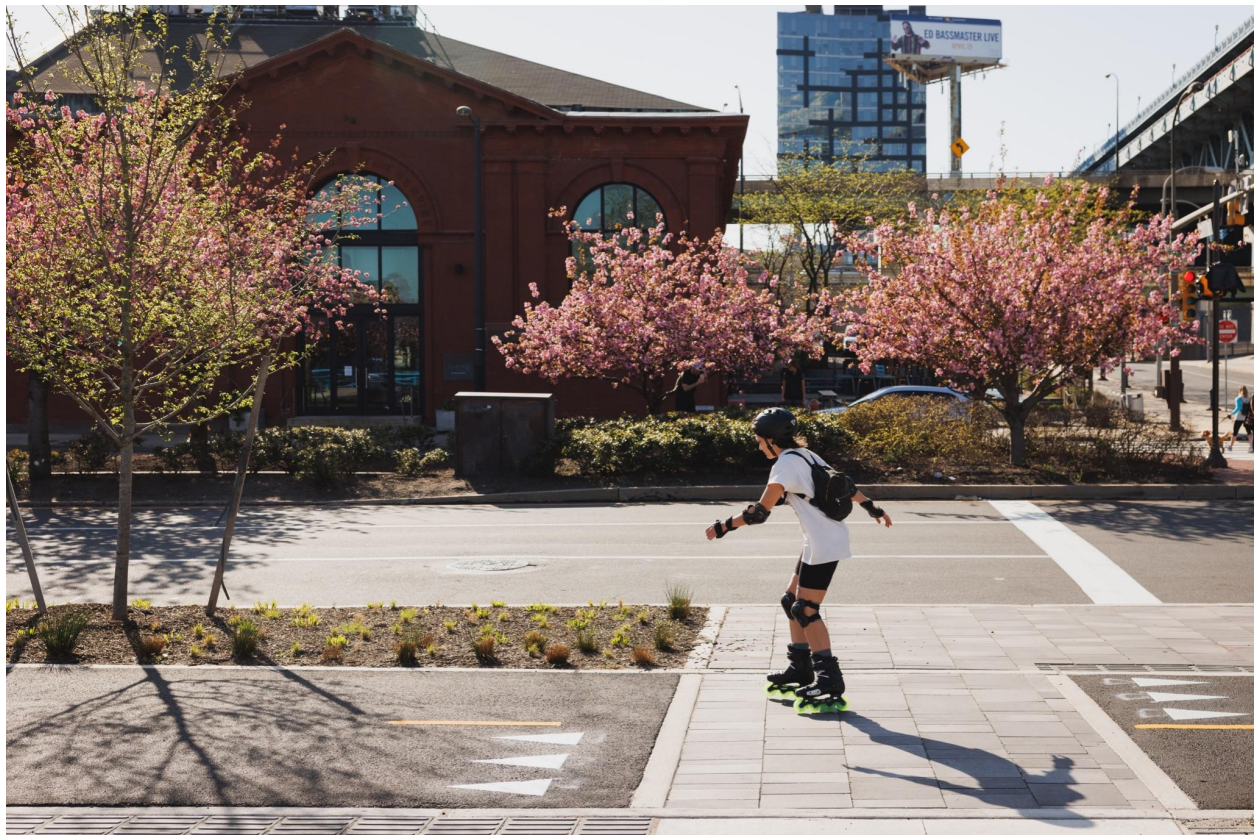

- PORTALS: Termite TV's 31st Anniversary Exhibition, April 7-23

Join us for a media extravaganza, *PORTALS*, to celebrate 30 years of experimental, activist, and community video created by Philly-based video collective Termite TV. Access to the exhibition is free and open to the public.

- First Fridays: April 7-December 1

Shop one-of-a-kind handmade finds from local creators and artists at the Artist and Artisans Market, explore the studios to see the Pier's resident artists at work and purchase an original piece of artwork. Plus, enjoy bites and sips from our local food vendors such as French Toast Bites.

### **Delaware River Trail Etiquette**

The new Delaware River Trail has become a beloved resource for easy, accessible transit along the Delaware River Waterfront. More than 340,000 pedestrians and cyclists have made the trail their go-to route to explore the city's cultural and commercial centers and the vibrant Waterfront neighborhoods that run along the 3.3-mile stretch.

With this trail-blazing new public space transforming how people navigate the Philadelphia Waterfront and beyond, it's important that trail-users have fun, be safe, and travel with care.
